Brecon Beacons

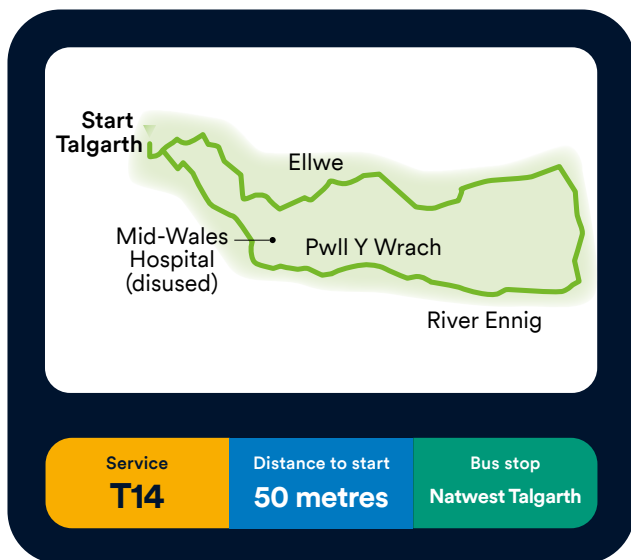

② Pwll-yr-Wrach Walk (Witches Pool)



This is an intermediate walk to the Pwll y Wrach waterfall and nature reserve. The reserve is in ancient woodland along the banks of the River Ennig. There are a series of waterfalls within the woodland, Pwll-y-Wrach is the largest. Local legend suggests that witches may have been ducked in this pool in medieval times! Our walk continues climbing up to the foothills of the Black Mountains for spectacular views or you can return to Talgarth after the waterfall for a shorter walk.

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Aberdare

Sitting at the base of the wide and grand Cynon Valley, there's a reason that Aberdare is affectionately known as the 'Queen of the Hills'. Enveloping the town is lush green valley banks, providing a beautiful hilly backdrop at every turn, and endless opportunities to explore surrounding natural beauty.

Walks

① Penderyn Four Falls Walk

Service 7	Distance to start 1000 steps	Bus stop Penderyn Capel Soar
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Experience a variety of terrain and see some of the best of Wales' natural beauty as you embark on a scenic adventure through Brecon Beacons National Park. The Penderyn and Sgwd yr Eira Falls Circular Walk takes you across the summit of Moel Penderyn, through colourful countryside and into an enchanting forested river valley. Here, you'll be met with a flurry of waterfalls, including the popular Sgwd yr Eira Falls. Keep a look out for the Red Lion Inn, perched on a hilltop with beautiful views over the village of Penderyn and Brecon Beacons National Park – the perfect place to stop for a drink and a bite to eat.

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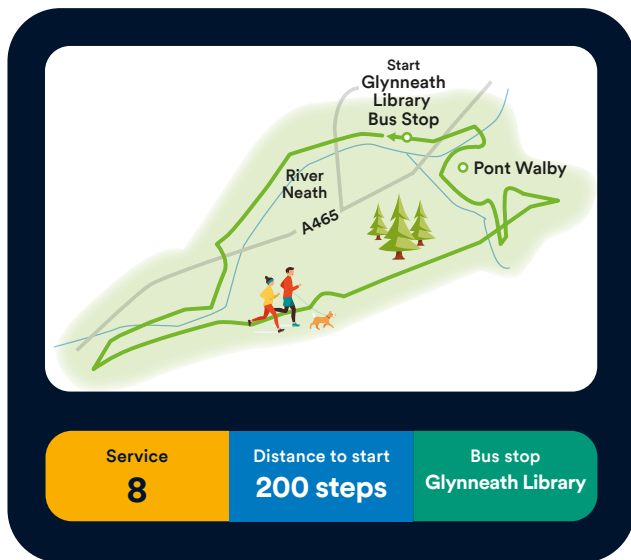


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② Glynneath Pontwalby



If you're looking for a short walk that takes you off road and through countryside, the Glynneath Pontwalby is a simple circular walk with the Pontwalby Viaduct at its centre. To extend your walk beyond the two-mile loop, just follow the Cwm Gwrelych Geo-Trail.

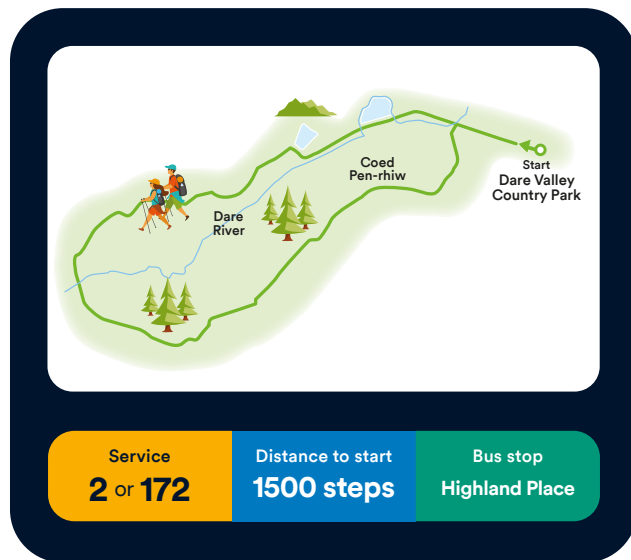

The circular walk from Dare Valley Country Park partly follows the ancient Coed Morganwg Way from the visitors' centre, before your ascent begins to take in those views. When the time comes for your descent, look forward to a sweet treat and a warm drink at the park's café.

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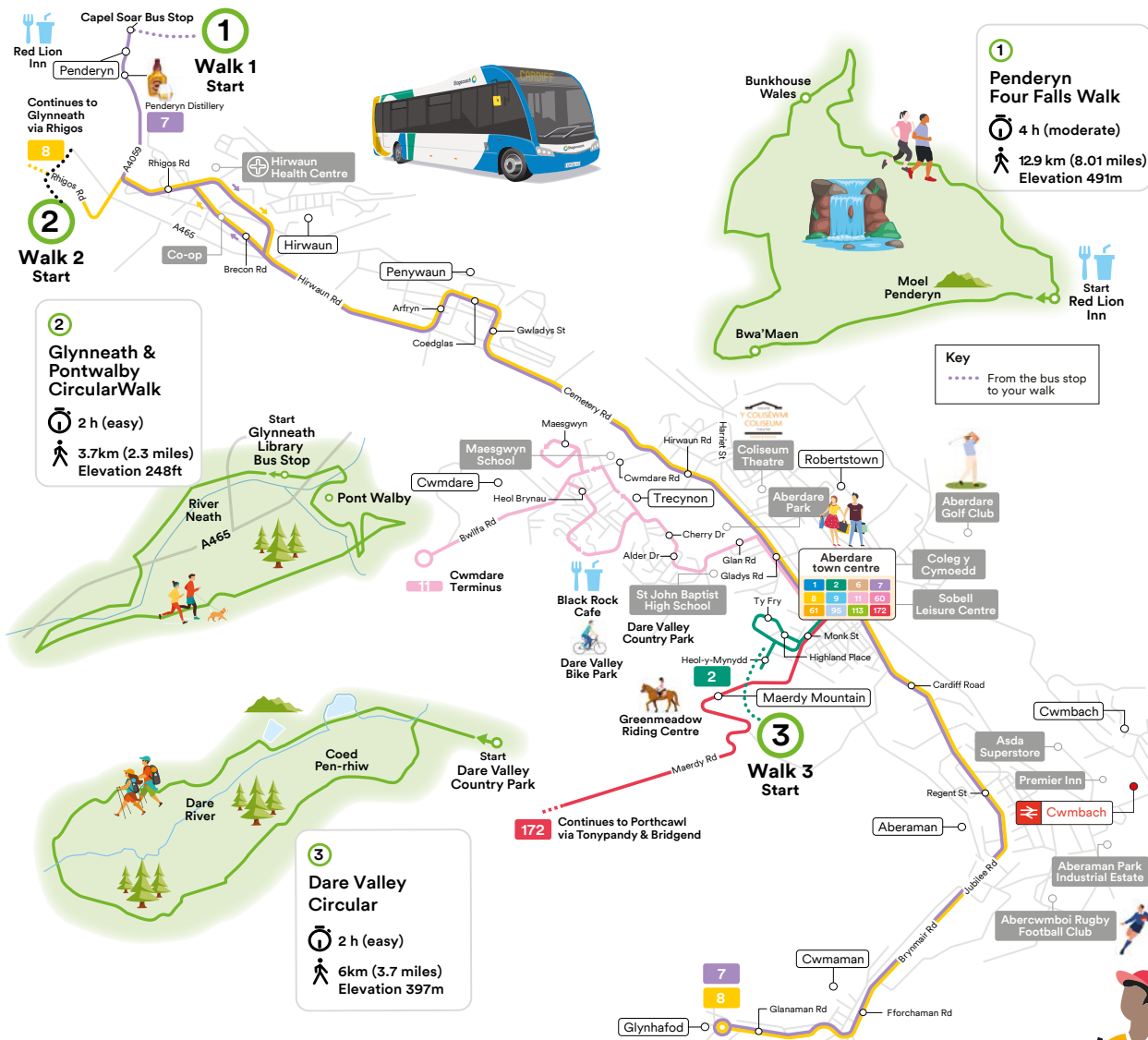

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Merthyr Tydfil

Merthyr Tydfil's valleys and hills are famous for their stunning scenery and historic attractions. Nestled between the capital city of Cardiff and the breathtaking Brecon Beacons, the trails in Merthyr Tydfil are true hidden treasures and now is a great time to uncover them.

Walks

① Pontsarn Viaduct & Blue Pool Walk



Service 25	Distance to start 500 steps	Bus stop High St, Cefn Coed
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Built in the 1860s to carry the Brecon and Merthyr Railway over the river, the iconic Pontsarn Viaduct is surrounded by natural beauty, making it the perfect central point for a wonderful walk. The popular route takes you past the Taf Fechan Nature Reserve, the famous Blue Pool, and a spectacular waterfall. If racking up 11,000 steps gives you an appetite, Julie's Castle Tea Rooms in the museum at Cyfarthfa Castle is a great place to grab a bite.

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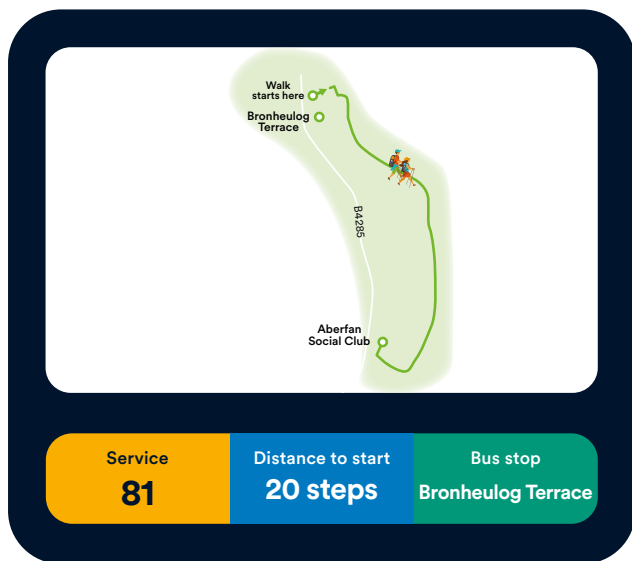
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② Troedyrhiw Walk

Of course, there are plenty more dining options to choose from, including a delicious pizza menu at Double Zero by Porthcawl Harbour and a tantalising selection of ice cream on the seafront at Piccolo Bar.

1 Porthcawl to Ogmore-by-Sea



Bridgend is blessed with captivating coastal beauty, and Newton beach is a firm favourite with locals and visitors. If you're after a wholesome long walk amidst the salty sea air breeze, then the coastal path from Porthcawl to Ogmore-by-Sea is a delight to explore. Making the most of the surroundings along the walk is a must, and there is plenty to see: from passing Coney Beach Pleasure Park, the Hi-Tide with its traditional amusements to exploring Ogmore Castle, Merthyr Mawr or Newton beach, this is a varied walk with a bit of something for everyone! If you fancy a break along the way, you could take a picnic and find a spot along the sandy beach or stop off at Newton green, there's a variety of pubs serving delicious food and cold drinks.

Setting off along the Porthcawl Promenade, you'll pass the iconic 1930s Grand Pavilion, coffee shops and ice cream parlours. Rest Bay Boardwalk is the perfect route to take it all in, you can walk right along the sea, all the way to Pink Bay Beach. This quiet and peaceful beach is named after the unique pink hue of its stones and pebbles. If you'd like to continue your walk, Sker House is nearby. You may have heard of this 900-year-old monastic grange, as it is in fact the setting for the novel "The Maid of Sker" by R.D. Blackmore. After all that walking you can reward yourself with a refreshing ice cream or hot drink from Sidoli's bar is a must, and if you're feeling peckish you can tuck in to delicious fish and chips from Beales.

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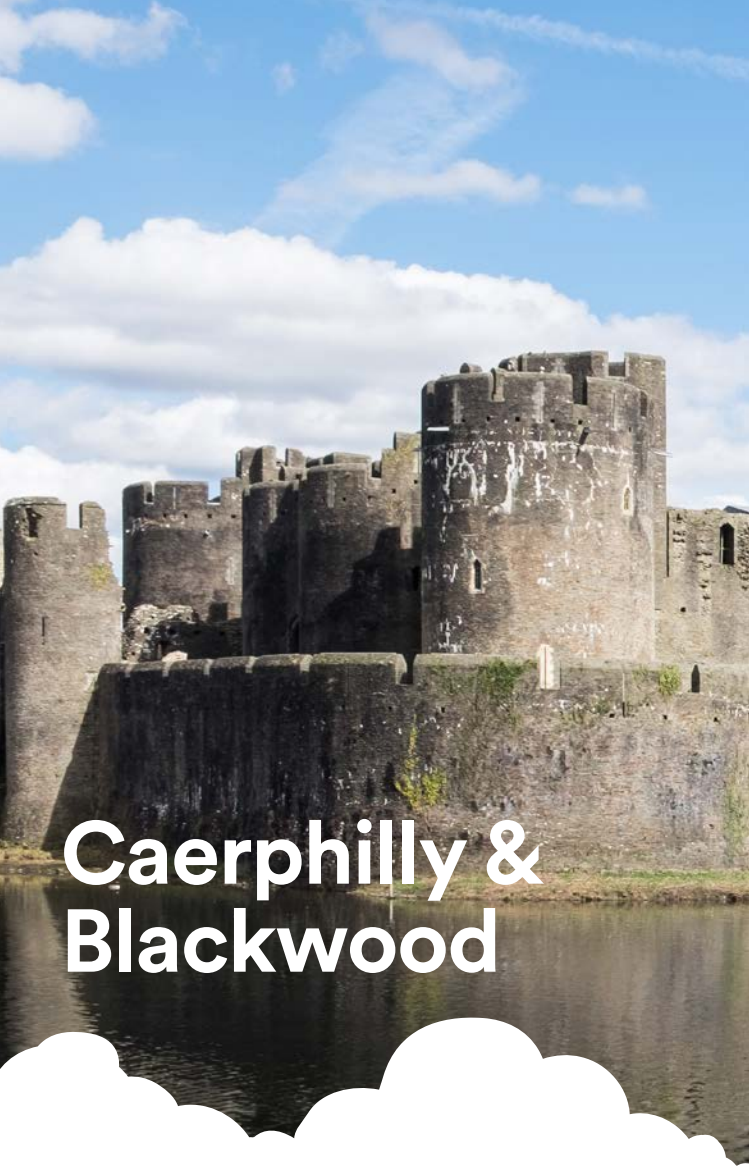


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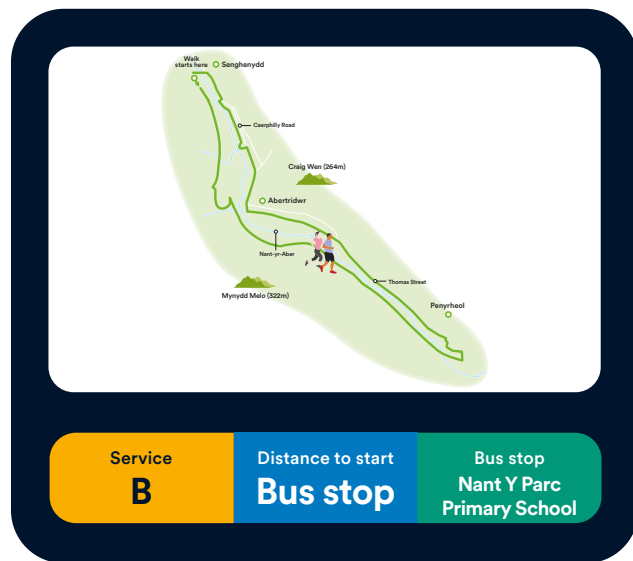


Caerphilly & Blackwood

Valleys, rivers, mountains and more – Caerphilly Country Borough has a such a diverse array of green spaces to explore. From leisurely lakeside strolls to amazing mountain hikes, there are beautiful scenic walks to suit every ability and mood.

Caerphilly Walks

① Senghenydd Walk



Explore the history of Caerphilly on an historic walking trail that begins in the Senghenydd and finishes in Abertidwr. Along the valley route, there are around 30 different points of interest, starting with the Welsh National & Universal Mining Memorial and ending with Aber Mill. Treat yourself to a post-walk drink in the Caerphilly Cwtch or refuel at Volare Italian, just around the corner from Caerphilly Interchange.

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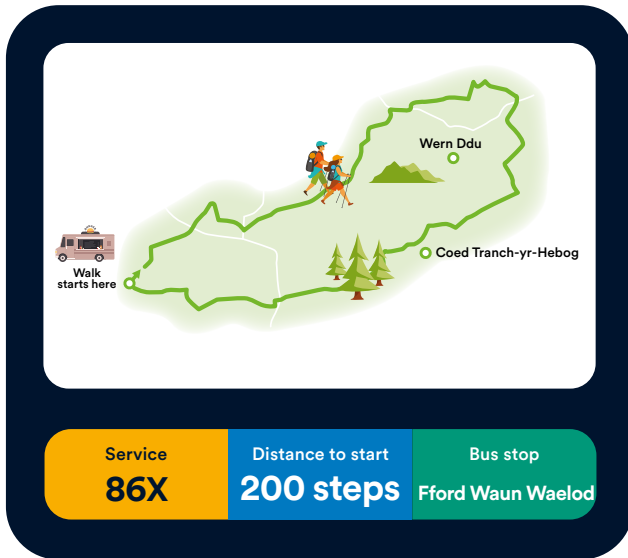


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② Caerphilly Mountain Walk



Don't be put off by its mountain status, Caerphilly Mountain is actually more of a big hill. On a clear day, this light hike will reward you with breathtaking panoramic views, so is worth the effort. Plus, the walk starts and finishes at the mountain's snack bar, ideal if you need a bit of energy before you set off, or feel hungry when you finish!

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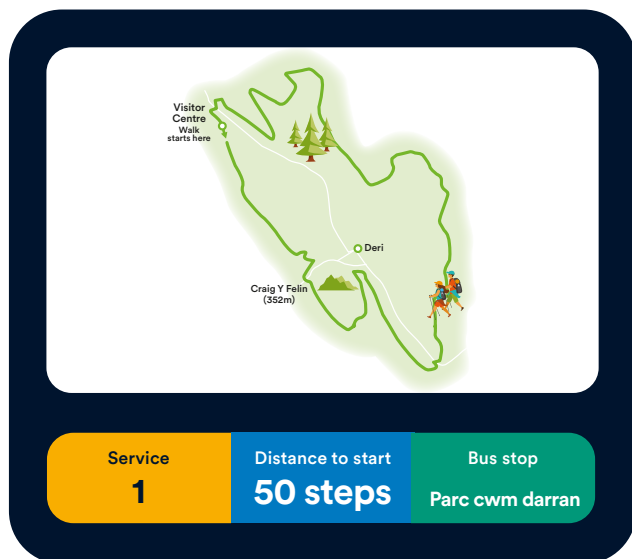


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Blackwood Walks

Refreshed and ready to explore, you can venture into the nearby woodland following a trail that takes you down to a free-flowing waterfall and Memorial Garden.

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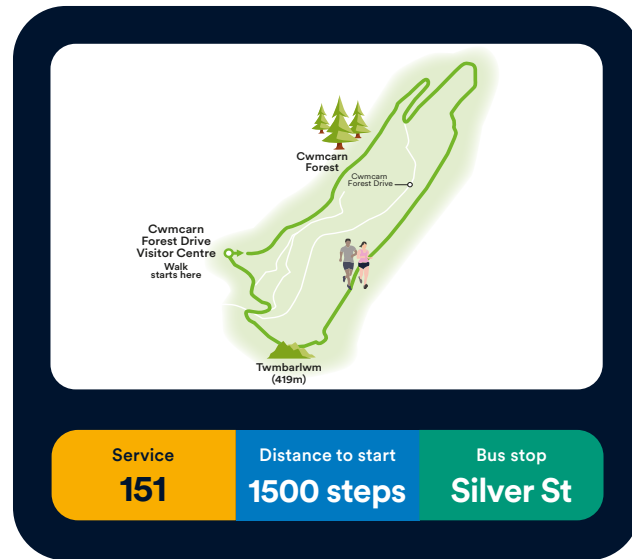


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4 Cwmcarn Forest Walk

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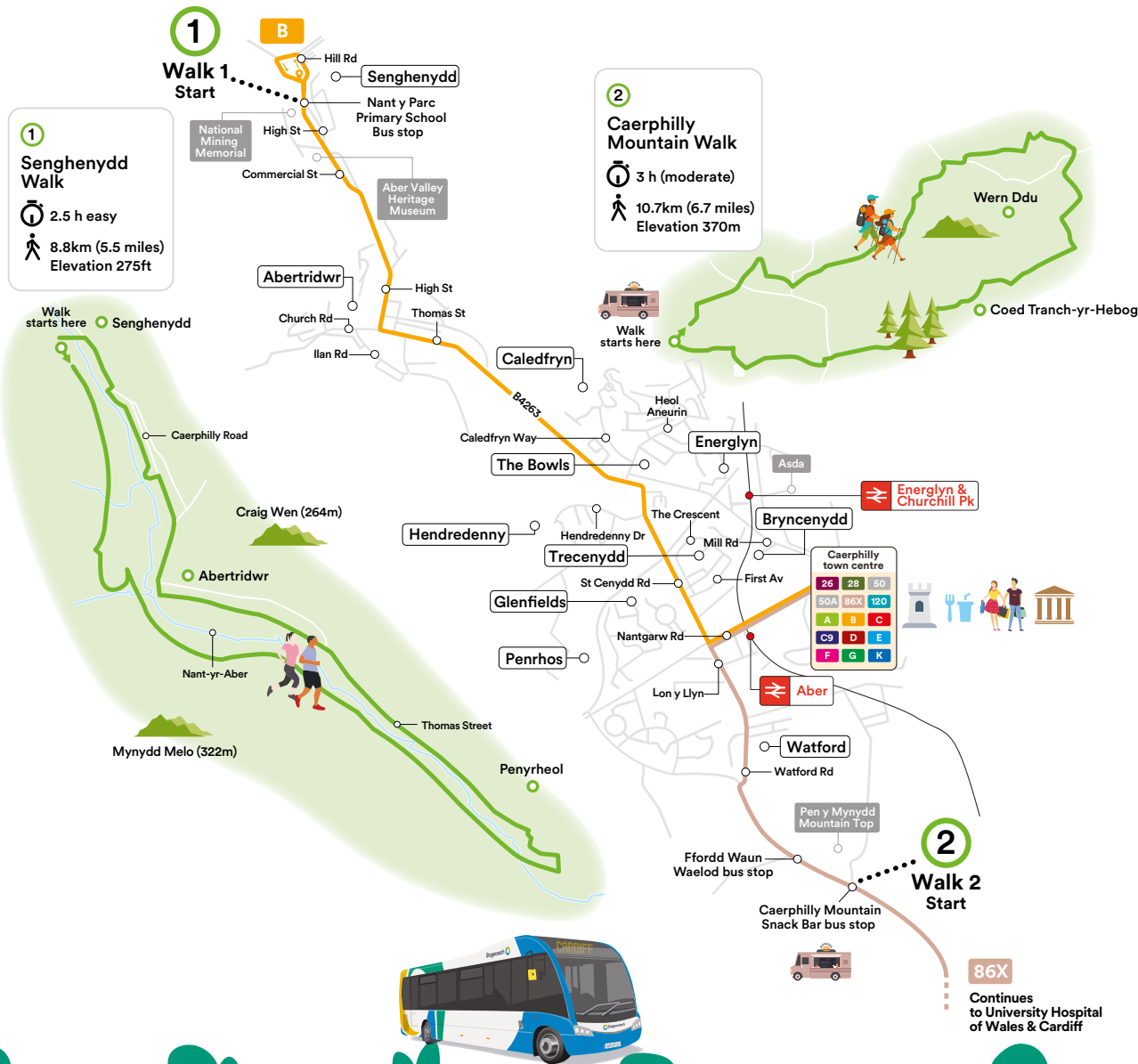


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Caerphilly Area Map

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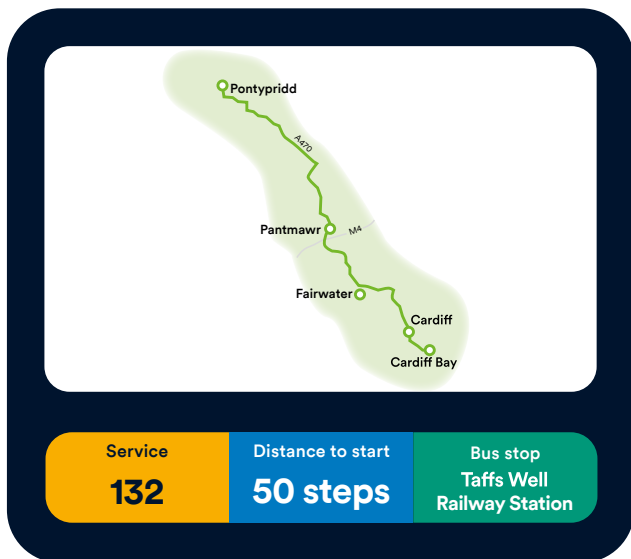


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② The Taff Trail

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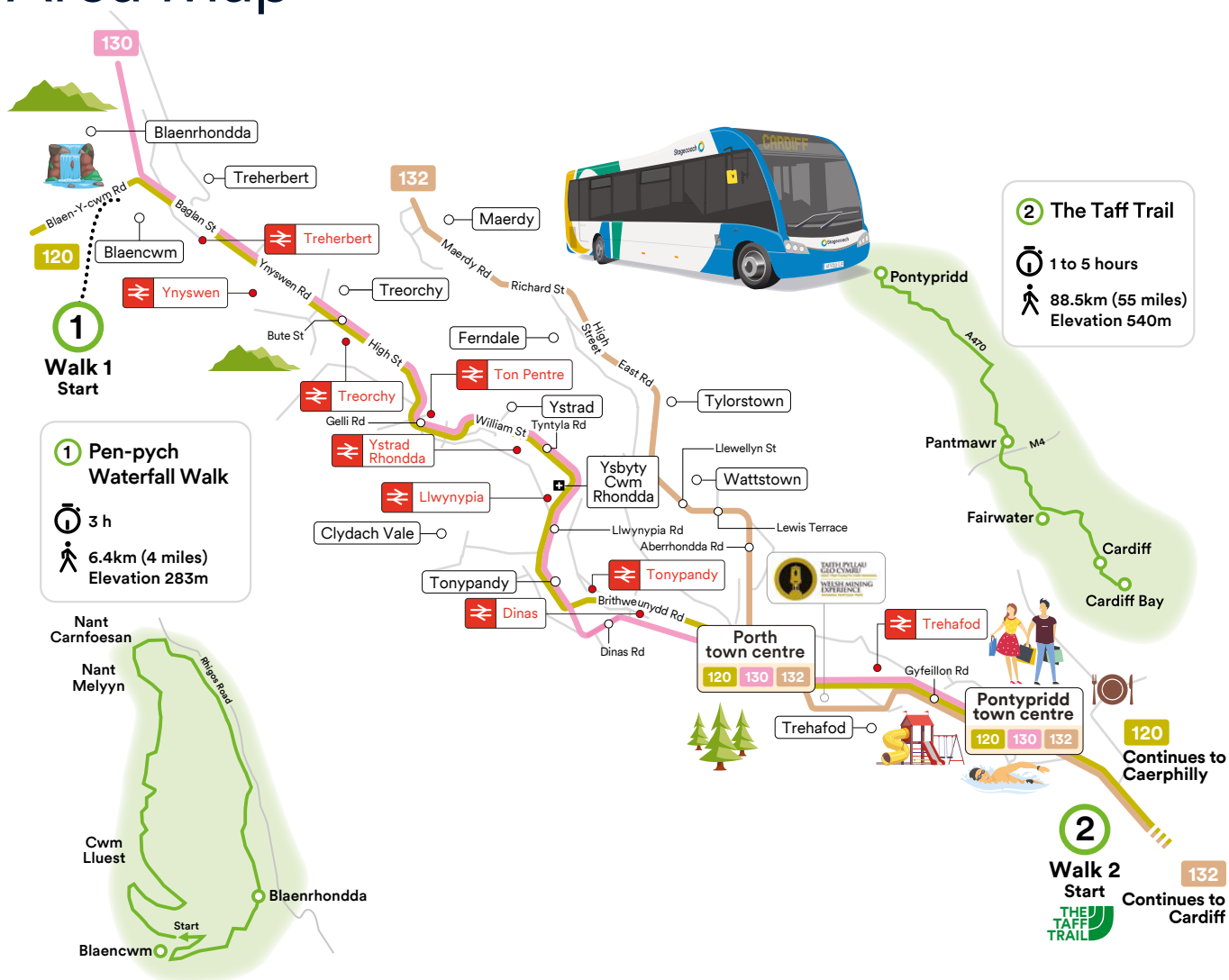


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Rhondda Area Map



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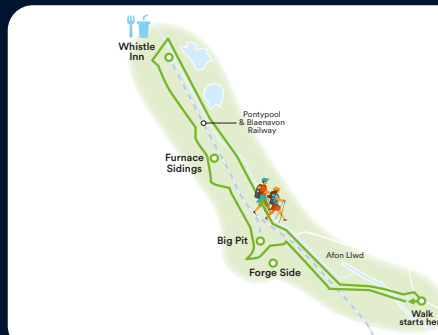

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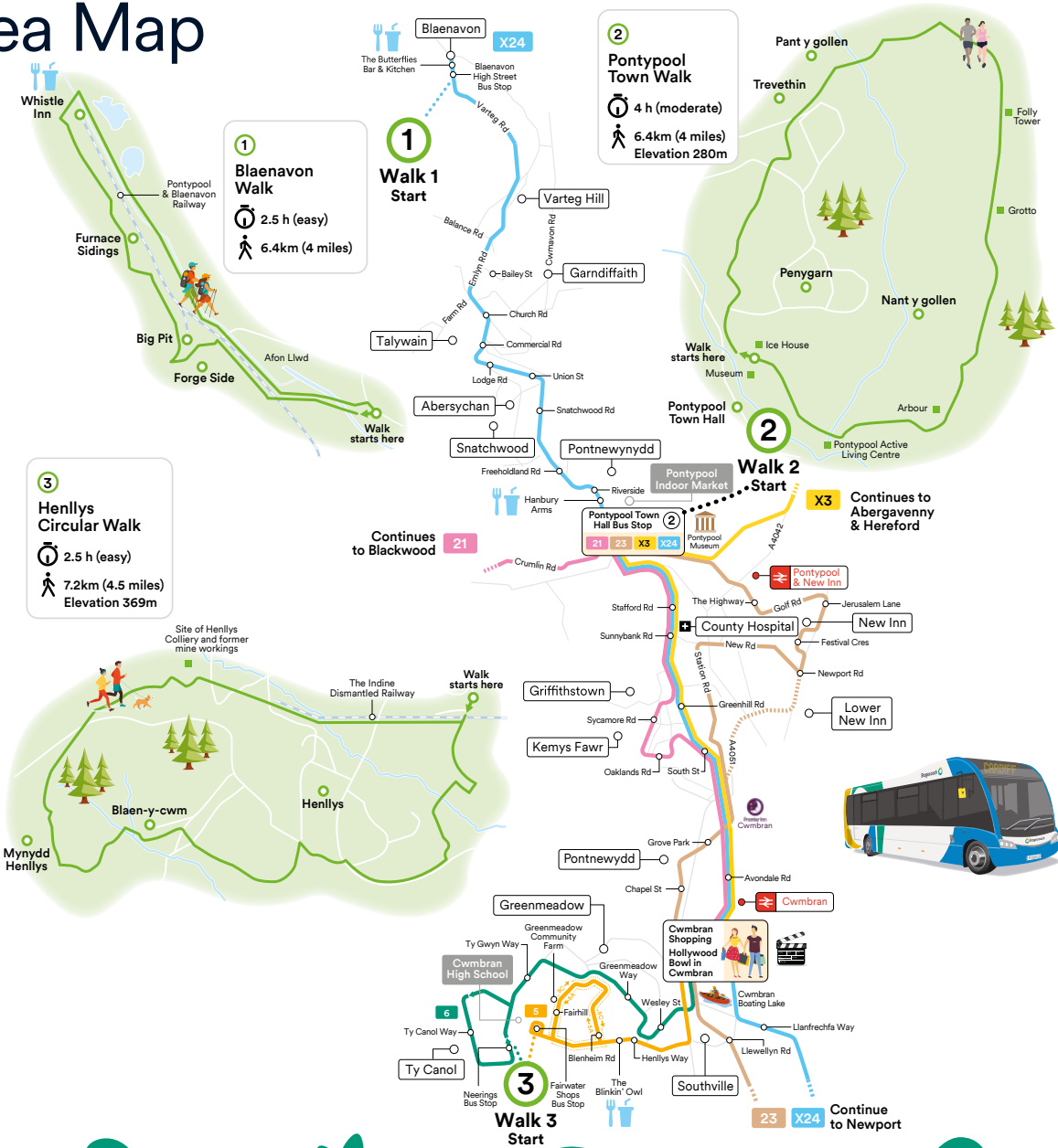

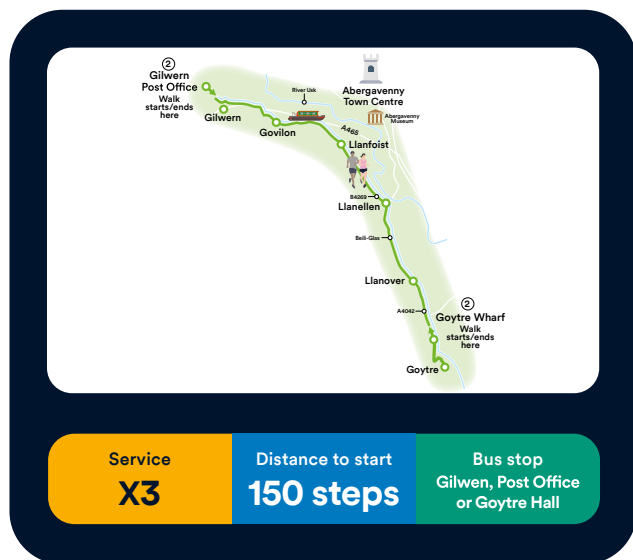

② Abergavenny Canal Walk

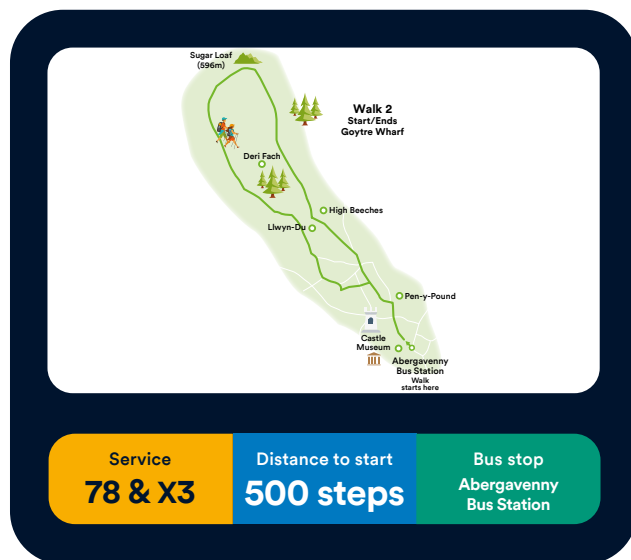


Beginning at either Goytre Wharf or Gilwern, walk along the canal, this serene trail takes you on a whirlwind tour through an array of locations including Llanellen and Abergavenny - it's a flat walk, so there are no hills to be wary of - phew! Shrouded in history, this picturesque trail was once the network of transport, as the canals were built for carrying coal, iron and limestone. To ensure your energy levels are sky high ahead of the 9 mile walk, grab a hot drink and a bite to eat at Penelope's café which is situated at the Goytre Wharf, or if you fancy a quick pit stop during the walk there is the Hummingbird in Llanover for a quick rest and refreshments.
