Welcome to your guide to getting around the Highlands with Stagecoach.

Service 25/25X will take you from Invergordon to Inverness.

The best part is - the same ticket that will take you to Inverness is also valid for travel to any of the attractions included in this leaflet, excluding Scottish Citylink service 919. For more details see overleaf.

Inverness

The northernmost city in the United Kingdom, Inverness is regarded as the capital of the Highlands and it offers tourists a wealth of historical marvels and attractions.

Highlights of the highlands include: Culloden Battlefield, Loch Ness Centre and Exhibition, Nairn Beach, Urquhart Castle and Inverness Castle.

Attractions in and around Inverness

Culloden Battlefield

Catch service 5 from Queensgate, Inverness to visit Culloden Battlefield. The Battle of Culloden was the final confrontation of the 1745 Jacobite Rising. On 16 April 1746 the Jacobite forces under Charles Edward Stuart were soundly defeated by loyalist troops commanded by Duke of Cumberland. This was the last pitched battle fought on British soil and it changed the Highlands and Scotland forever. **Service 5 operates to Culloden Battlefield from Inverness city centre every hour Monday to Saturday.**



Urquhart Castle



Urquhart Castle is one of the most picturesque landmarks in Scotland. Perched on the banks of Loch Ness beside the village of Drumnadrochit, it offers great views up the length of the loch, and is one of the main sites for reported sightings of the legendary Loch Ness Monster. Take service 919 from Inverness bus station to visit Urquhart Castle.

Nairn Beach



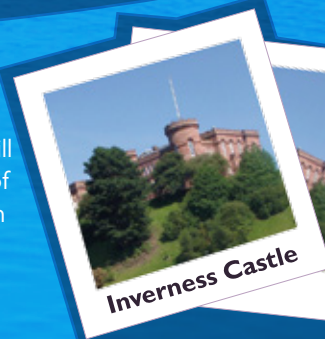
Nairn Beach is located 16 miles east of Inverness and offers visitors miles of beautiful coastline and breathtaking views across the Moray Firth. Both the harbour and marina in Nairn offer spectacular views across the Moray Firth as well as dolphin watching opportunities. **Travel on service 10 or 11 for Nairn Beach.** The beach is a 10 minute walk from the bus route.

Loch Ness Centre and Exhibition



Board service 919 from Inverness bus station for Loch Ness Centre and Exhibition, located in Drumnadrochit. The centre explores the history of Loch Ness, from the ice age to the third millennium in a themed, automated walk through. Visitors learn about the history of the Loch and the many mysteries that have surrounded its past. Learn about the rumours, the hoaxes and the truths and discover what may really live in Loch Ness.

Inverness Castle



The original Inverness castle was built by Macbeth, but was destroyed by Malcolm Canmore in 1057. Today the site consists of a fortress built in 1835 which now houses Inverness Sheriff Court but you can still walk around the grounds and take in the views of the city as the castle sits on a low cliff on the east bank of the river Ness, providing excellent views of the city. The castle is just a 10 minute walk from the bus station in Inverness with a brand new North Tower viewpoint. This stunning addition allows visitors to have 360 degree views of the city.

Service 5 Inverness - Culloden Battlefield

Mon - Sat only: up to every hour. Journey time is 30 minutes (approx).

Service 10/11 Inverness - Nairn

Mon - Sat: up to 3 buses an hour. Sun: up to 2 buses an hour.
Journey time is approximately 30 minutes.

Tickets

A dayrider ticket gives you unlimited travel for that day within a ticket zone so you can travel as often you like all day.

Inverness zone 3 tickets will take you from Invergordon to Inverness as well as onward travel to any of the attractions included in this leaflet! Please note Stagecoach tickets are not valid on Citylink service 919.

Inverness zone 3

Adult dayrider for just **£12** or **€15**

Group dayrider for just **£23.85** or **€30**

Group dayrider tickets are valid for: 1 adult and up to 3 children, or up to 2 adults and 2 children or up to 3 adults only.
*children must be aged under 16 and carry appropriate proof of age.

Please note: we are now able to accept contactless payments on board our buses. For cash payments our drivers will be able to give change in GBP. Unfortunately we are unable to give change in Euros.
